Yorkton Canada Flood Statistics July 1 to July 13, 2010 (all numbers are approximate)

Public Works

- 1500 garbage pickups with 500 remaining
- 20 to 25 basements pumped out and 15 lots pumped out
- 3360 man hours
- 4 houses had water shut off due to structural issues
- garbage clean up \$60,000 (approximately \$5,000/day)
- Contracted Services - \$12,000
- Supplies - \$4,000
- Estimated repair of damages to infrastructure – storm sewer outlet – Smith Street and Dracup Avenue - \$25,000
- Dracup Avenue between Darlington Street and Smith Street - \$15,000

Environmental Services

- 40 extra water tests performed
- Average tonnage into the landfill at 300 tons per day, average normal tonnage is 40 tons per day

RCMP

- 60 calls for service

Provincial Disaster Assistance Program (PDAP)

Red Cross

- 209 people registered (152 adults and 57 children)
- People placed into accommodation 68
- \$38,990 in vouchers issued for clothing, accommodation, food
- 36 volunteers and 16 staff members have been involved, with approximately 1312 combined hours dedicated to the Yorkton disaster
- The Co-op donated \$2,000 worth of cleaning products and Wal-Mart donated \$1,000 worth of pails and mops
- 124 cleaning kits received, 62 were kept at the Service Centre and 62 were given to the Salvation Army for their kiosk

Salvation Army

- Total food hampers distributed to date – 189 for a cost of \$7,120
- Refreshments served to 945 people at a cost of \$867
- Total number of volunteers 49 for a total of 397 hours
- Total number of paid staff – 112 for a total of 336 hours at a cost of \$5,040

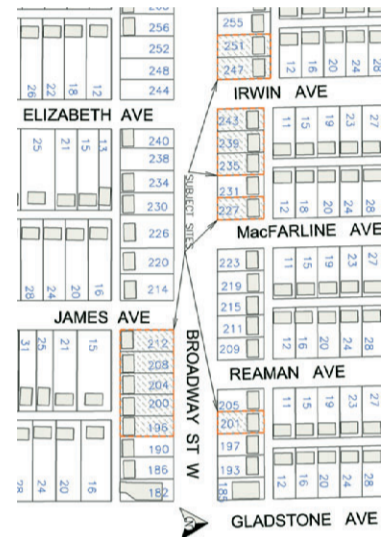
