PUBLIC NOTICE

Proposed Bylaw No. 22/2011

The Council of the City of Yorkton, pursuant to Section 207 of The Planning and Development Act, 2007, hereby gives notice of its intention to pass Bylaw No. 22/2011, which is an amendment to City of Yorkton Municipal Development Plan Bylaw No. 15/2003 to remove the development phasing designation of LSD 16 in the Northeast Quarter of Section 36, Township 25, Range 4, West of the 2nd Meridian (LSD 16, NE 36-25-4-W2) from Schedule 'C' – Future Residential, Commercial, Industrial and Parks and Recreation Map.

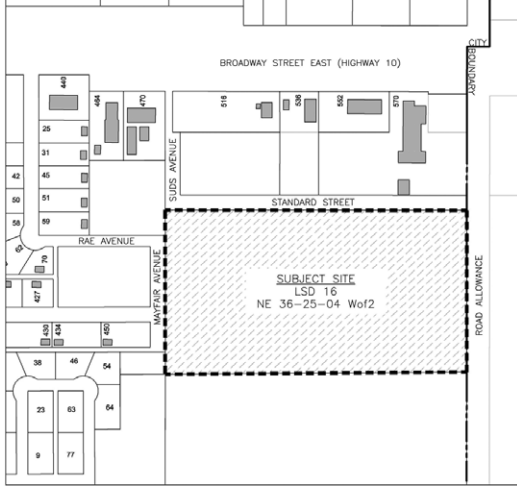
The purpose of the proposed bylaw is to allow for commercial development on the subject property in the short-to-medium term future. Should Bylaw No. 22/2011 be approved, the property will remain with an Environmentally Sensitive overlay, so that the City can ensure protection of the nearby shallow aquifer.

LEARN ABOUT OUR NEW WATER TREATMENT PLANT

Yorkton's water is continually tested to make sure it meets or exceeds Saskatchewan's Drinking Water Quality Standards and Objectives. Whenever you turn on your tap you can be confident that the water is safe and ready to use. The Queen Street Water Treatment Plant began supplying water to the City of Yorkton distribution system in January 2011. Prior to that there were four older plants for treating water, one that dates back to the 1930's. The Queen Street Water Treatment Plant uses a Greensand Gravity Filtration System and has the capability of producing 22,000 cubic meters of water per day. The City's water source is groundwater. There are a number of wells located around the city that supply the treatment plant. Water quality is assessed by measuring amounts of various constituents contained in the water. Groundwater tends to be harder and more saline than surface water. With the operation of the Queen Street Water Treatment Plant our turbidity levels now meet the regulations handed down by the Ministry of Environment. Turbidity is the cloudiness caused by individual particles (suspended solids) that are generally invisible to the naked eye. The measurement of turbidity is a key test for drinking water quality. Iron and Manganese are metallic elements found in many rock types. Concentrations of iron and manganese in groundwater are often higher than those measured in surface waters. The table below shows the comparison of the water quality data for the old plants and the new plant.

PEST CONTROL PROGRAMS

The City of Yorkton spring and summer pest control program is underway throughout the City. Signs are posted in areas where products are applied. The following programs are included:

Weed control – Par III and Roundup is used for weed control.

Mosquito control – Vectobac treats mosquito larvae in standing water.

Leaf eating insects – Pounce, Bti and Kathane will control leaf rolling/eating worms, aphids and insects.

Ground squirrel/gopher control – RoZol RTU grain will be used to control these pests on sports fields and other areas as required.

2011 WATER MAIN FLUSHING PROGRAM

The Public Works Department began a water main flushing program on **Sunday, June 5, 2011 at 8:00 p.m.** Flushing is required to remove the rust and sediment that has accumulated in the water mains. City crews will be flushing the mains from approximately **8:00 p.m. through to 6:00 a.m. until completed.** Flushing will begin on the **West Side of the City** on the first evening and move towards the **East Side of the City** thereafter.

During flushing, the water will contain a considerable amount of rust and sediment, and may be discolored for several hours. The system pressure will fluctuate during the flushing period. Both the sediment and the low pressure can cause problems in the operation of plumbing fixtures, especially air conditioning, refrigeration equipment, and water softeners. Doing laundry is not recommended, as the discolored water will stain clothing. For this reason, it is advisable not to use water if it is discolored unless it is absolutely necessary to do so.

Residents who live in the areas being flushed should collect containers of water beforehand for drinking and cooking, before the flushing program starts. Residents should use as little water as possible, and should avoid drawing water into their homes. It's best not to use your washing machine or dishwasher until the water color returns to normal.

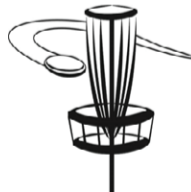

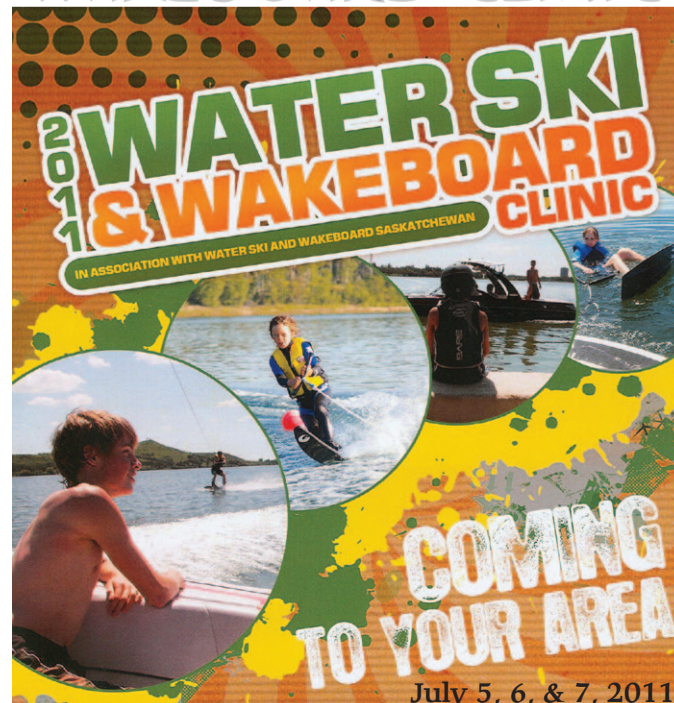
